OUR MISSION



MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

With a second full year of the pandemic, French for the Future had to show resilience, flexibility and creativity to continue to reach youths aged 12 to 18 and their teachers across Canada through its activities.

Maintaining participation levels in our programs has not been easy; however, thanks to the team's tireless efforts and our partners' support, we have reached more than 39,000 youths across the country with a virtual National Ambassador Youth Forum, hundreds of Franconnexion Sessions, our National Essay Contest, our correspondents program, and our youth committee, not to mention our Local Forums. Twelve of our Local Forums were held online and we finished the year in style with three Local Forums held in person again.

In February 2022, we also launched a brand-new platform that is available 24/7 for 14 to 17 years old: the Fr+ platform. Appearing alongside the pre-existing offer of French for the Future's programs, it enables youths to "do more in French." In the Anglophone cultural ocean that is North America, Fr+ creates a Canadian Francophone space that transcends provincial and territorial boundaries, brings together Francophone and Francophile youths, and enables them to anchor their French skills in recreation.

In 2021-2022, we had more opportunities to celebrate, with the addition of the Université de l'Ontario français as a new partner for our National Essay Contest, French for the Future's involvement in the first public celebration of Linguistic Duality Day, and of course the tabling in March 2022 of Bill C-13 to modernize the Official Languages Act.

It is with great pride that I look at everything we have accomplished this year, and the support that we have been able to provide to all these youths who are moving along the road of bilingualism. Of course, I want to thank the French for the Future team, our coordinators, facilitators, partners and donors, volunteers and our Board of Directors, without whom none of this would have been possible. Let's continue to shape tomorrow's bilingual Canada together!



STUDENTS IN GRADES 10, 11 AND 12



OCTOBER TO DECEMBER

Through the National Essay Contest, French for the Future has awarded 96 scholarships between \$1,000 and \$20,000 to students in Grades 10, 11, and 12 (Secondary IV and V or CÉGEP 1 in Quebec) and has encouraged them to continue their post-secondary studies in French at one of its 14 partner institutions:



In 2021, more than 430 students across Canada participated in this contest by submitting a 750 word essay answering the question:

In a future where everything is possible, how will the food we eat and the way it is produced have changed?

Thanks to this contest, the participants gained confidence in their level of French and planned to continue their education in French. Among them, 96 happy winners shared scholarships with a total value of \$368,000.





This year, French for the Future has once again provided teachers with an electronic resource kit to help them organize fun and educational activities in French. More than 600 teachers were able to use the tools/resources with their students in grades 7 to 12, covering topics such as the advantages of bilingualism and the challenges that Francophone and Francophile students may encounter in their education. All the resources were developed to motivate the learning of French. A new “humour” section was added to the kit this year and quickly became one of the teachers’ favourite sections.

AUGUST

The National Ambassador Youth Forum, a fun and educational event, took place online in 2021.

French for the Future selected 25 Grade 10 and 11 students (Secondary III or IV in Quebec) who were enrolled in a French program (Core French, intensive French, immersion, Francophone schools).



The selected students spent six interactive days that included discussions and workshops on project management and leadership. Through this training, the participants gained necessary skills in organizing events and they became ambassadors of the French language with the mission of promoting French throughout the 2021-2022 school year.

The “United Bilingual Correspondents” program was launched in January 2019 by youths for youths.

In 2021-2022, this program gave teenagers the opportunity to use their French outside the classroom and to expand their Francophone network. Enrolled youths were partnered and they committed to stay in contact with their correspondent throughout the school year.

Thanks to this program, French for the Future’s United Bilingual Correspondents had the opportunity to meet other bilingual Canadians their age and improve their French-language skills.

They were made aware of the diversity of the Francophonie in Canada and were encouraged to use French as a language of personal expression.








GOAL :

It is with great pride that French for the Future launched the interactive platform Fr+ in February 2022. Since its launch, it has garnered close to 300 registrations and continues to make progress thanks to user feedback. Fr+ gives young Francophones and Francophiles the opportunity to use the language in a real and relaxed setting.

Want to practice French at 3:00 a.m. on a Saturday night? You can do it! Fr+ lets users be themselves and talk about topics that interest them with other Francophones and Francophiles. On Fr+, there are no assessments or homework. Scenarios are no longer hypothetical and French is used in an authentic context.

Fr+ is a microcosm of Canada's Francophone community: youths laugh in French, get involved in French and make friends in French with other youths of the same age. Fr+ is a space where French is associated with emotions connected to sincere and natural exchanges.
